### Agenda

**1. Welcome & Introductory remarks by the Chairman:**

- Shri Amrish Patel was in the Chair.
- Permission for digital recording of the meeting was sought.
- After completion of first three years of autonomy, the Governing Body reconstituted for next term of three years starting June 2021. New members on the reconstituted Governing Body were introduced to the house by Dr. Krutika B. Desai, I/c. Principal.
- Dr. Krutika B. Desai welcomed all the members on behalf of the Chairman.

**3. To confirm the draft minutes of last meeting of Governing Body held on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2021:**

There being no correction/s suggested, it was RESOLVED that the minutes of last meeting of the Governing Body held on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2021 be confirmed and signed.

### **Action Taken Report:**

#### Declaration of results

The Chair stated as to why declaration of results of postgraduate (PG) were delayed beyond stipulated time of 30 days, although there are less numbers of students. To avoid late declaration of results, it was suggested that the results can be declared programme wise/in phase like M.A. at one time, M.Sc. at one time, and likewise also for undergraduate (UG) programmes such as BMS, BBI & so on. It was also suggested that next time while data of declaration of results will be presented, one more column for number of students appeared – added and programmes in deficit be highlighted.

#### Teachers training for setting of question papers and evaluation methods

It was suggested that the first round of training be a generalized training for all faculty of colleges under SVKM banner. This should be followed by training as per domain specific method.

Remuneration to be finalized by Shri Amit Sheth, Incharge-Mithibai College.

#### Soft skills

It was suggested that the Soft Skills Training Officer appointed by the Management should be given the task in the remaining time whenever s/he is not busy for soft skill training in classrooms as per timetable.



**4. Principal's review of the activities & major events:**

Admissions

It was observed that there were less numbers of students admitted below the intake capacity, particularly for PG programmes such as M.Com. & M.Sc. and also for some UG programmes i.e. B.Sc. The Principal informed that B.Sc.-Applied Statistics & Data Analytics (Honours) is a new programme introduced this year, which will take 2-3 years to increase demand & popularity. For PG programmes she mentioned that we have shortage of space in laboratories where practicals are conducted, so desired number of students at a time cannot be accommodated. It was, therefore, suggested to take overall stock of situation and check possibility of discontinuing the programmes which are not in demand by the students or to combine the programmes similar in nature viz. two M.Com. in one, two M.Sc. similar programmes in one, etc. It was informed that for aided courses we have no option but to continue them. The Chair specified need to discuss internally the reasons for low interest of students for certain subjects/programmes. The Principal informed that it might be due to hike in fees, stringent attendance norms, high percentage of cut off for admission, etc.

Results analysis (subject-wise)

The Principal was requested to check the results, which is high for SYBA Sem.-IV in the subject of Emerging Fields in Sociology.

Suggestion was made to notify students well in advance that the examinations will be conducted exclusively on offline mode.

Training & Placement

It was mentioned that the Training & Placement activity is not happening upto the desired level. It may be due to lack of knowledge by the present Placement Officer & Soft Skills Officer appointed by the SVKM as they are giving excuses of non-availability of classrooms & lack of subject knowledge of students, syllabus/textbook/reference books, etc. It is not certain whether the blame goes to students or trainer/s.

It was suggested that rigorous criteria should be applied to select outside trainers & a system of pre-approval put in place.

Shri Amit Sheth informed that we have invited industrialist & that subject-wise brochure is being prepared. The Chair directed Shri Amit Sheth to take lead by convening a meeting of persons concerned to solve the issue of Training & Placement so that Soft skills be made compulsory for First Year level next year.



**5. To consider the Recommendations of 12<sup>th</sup> Academic Council meeting held on 25<sup>th</sup> September, 2021:**

With regard to progression rule of implementing ATKT in three subject to No ATKT for students from academic year 2022-23 progressively, the house was informed that the college already gives second chance to failed students to appear for re-examination, and that there is no injustice made to the students. This progression rule is required for enhancing quality of education.

(Ref. Draft Minutes of 9<sup>th</sup> GB meeting for 10<sup>th</sup> GB meeting on 30/03/2022)

3	ATR	Declaration of results (program-wise)	<p>At present, in Mithibai college, there are 14 UG programs and 17 PG programs, thus, in each semester there are 38 UG results (i.e. each of semesters 1, 3 &amp; 5 taken together and semesters 2,4 &amp; 6 taken together) and 33 PG results (i.e. each of semesters 1 &amp; 3 and semesters 2 &amp; 4 taken together).</p> <p>Currently, we are processing and declaring the results semester wise. After the result declaration, 3 days are given to the students to apply for photocopy and/or reevaluation. Subsequently, reevaluation is done after which results are processed and declared. Within 3-4 days (during which the grade cards need to be generated) of the reevaluation results the re-examination portal opens in the system for all the programs together. The timelines of all these are discussed and finalised approx. two months in advance.</p> <p>As the schedule for the conduct of exam for a particular semester ranges from 8-10 days for UG and 6-8 days for PG, the evaluation and moderation is expected to be completed on a scheduled date in order to process and declare results on the date as per the timelines fixed after discussions in the Exam Committee with the Chief Controller of Examinations and Controller of Examinations. It becomes feasible to keep a track of the result declaration timelines; reevaluation portal dates etc. semester wise as well as coordination for all these activities.</p> <p>If we take the approach of processing and declaring the results program wise (71 results), there would be several different timelines to meet which may not be practically very feasible to track and work upon.</p> <p>At present, the system (SAP) is also not developed to handle single program wise reevaluation portal after program wise result declaration and the same is for the program wise re-exam portal.</p> <p>In view of the above as it is not feasible to declare results in phase-wise manner, it is proposed to continue with semester wise UG and PG result declaration as per the current practice and instead bring in firm timelines for timely evaluation and moderation work.”</p>

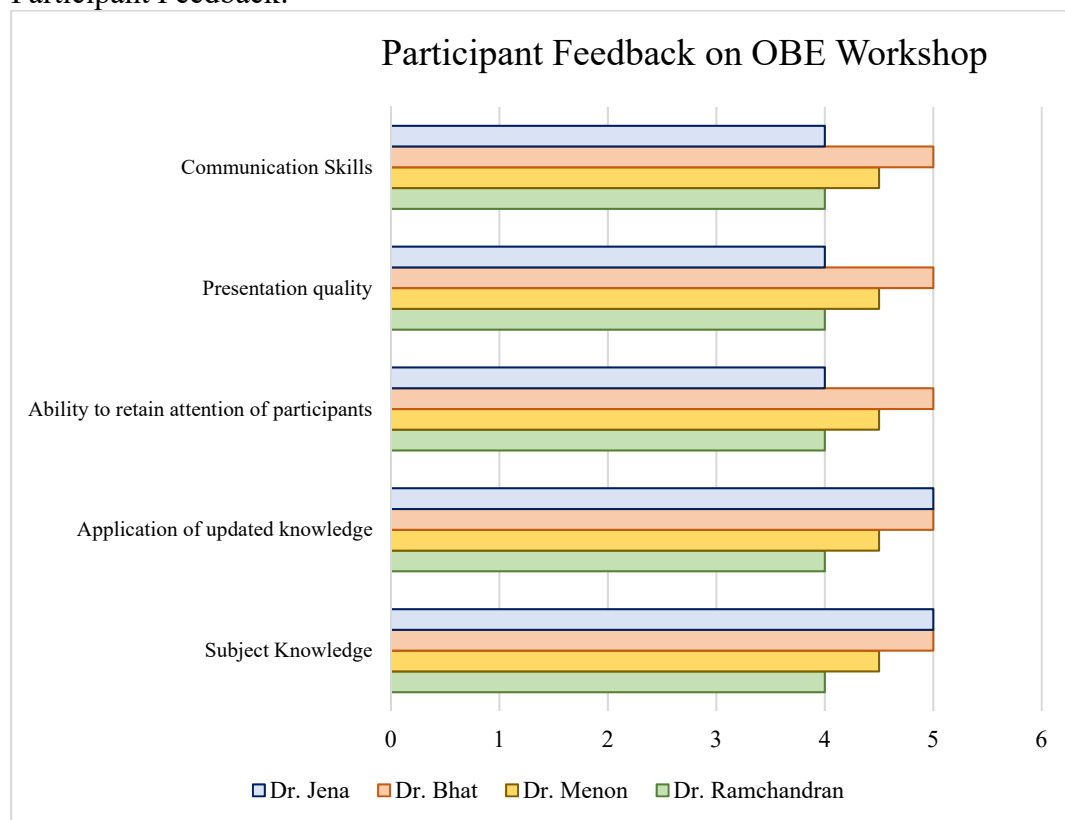
**IN-CHARGE PRINCIPAL’S REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES & MAJOR EVENTS**

The above committee had a meeting to discuss in detail the revised fee structures of various programs of Under-graduate and Post-graduate studies and after certain deliberations and discussions, the fee rise @15% proposed for the financial year 2022 -2023 was unanimously approved as shown in <b>Annexure – V.</b> The above fee rise will cover the total deficit to some extent though there will be still deficit on account of implementation of VII pay commission and large number of appointments made on Contractual basis in absence of NOCs from the Government since 2017-2018. It was unanimously decided by the Finance Committee and <b>RESOLVED THAT:</b> The fee hike @ 15% across be approved for the financial year 2022-2023 and sent for the final approval of Governing Body.
