CORONA - The Invisible Enemy Of The World And my Online Teaching Experience.

Corona virus (Covid-19) has literally shaken the world, resulting in lockdown. It was never heard of, but it (CORONA) came and stopped the entire world, forcing all of us to sit at home. It happened in March 2020, when students were busy with their exams and our financial year was about to end. On March 24, our Honorable Prime Minister ordered a nationwide lockdown as a preventive measure against the COVID-19 pandemic in India. So people had to stay where they were. Most of the people were stuck at different places. No one was seen on the road. Our Mumbai city which never sleeps, stopped completely due to Corona.

We all were very curious to know "what will happen next?" Because everyday cases were increasing in our state and country. T.V Channels were giving us updates from time to time and we started getting news under the title "Corona Special/100." Government increased Corona tests and patients were taken to

Corona centers like- Hospitals, Schools, Marriage Halls, etc. Thousands of people, all over the world were losing their life everyday but thank God that we were safe at our home.

So we had nothing to do at home during lockdown - just eat, rest and watch TV. But thanks to our technology that we remained in contact with the outside world through Mobile and TV. Mobile became our best friend that connected us with the entire world through social media like -What's up, Facebook, Twitter, You Tube, etc.

We saw the viral videos of police taking strict action against the people who were out unnecessarily. But during lockdown also Internet companies were doing their business very well and made profit. Our WhatsApp University has done fantastic job of giving us enough information about Corona. Everyday our What'sapp inbox was flooded with messages related to Corona (protection and various remedies of it). Many people faced various health issues. We had to take care of our physical and mental health

TV was the best source of entertainment for all of us. Almost all the channels started telecasting their best programs. Thanks to Doordarshan Channel for telecasting epics like "Ramayana" and "Mahabharata." Every house became like a home in "Big Boss" program. Initially all of us enjoyed the company of each other, then some differences of opinion, disputes and come to know the real nature of people around us. Corona has taught us who are our real friends and relatives. After unlock phase one some concession was given. E.g.



permission to marriage ceremony with 50 people. 20 people were allowed for funeral/ Cremation. We Mumbaikars want to come back to our normal life and want to listen our familiar sound- "Local arriving on platform no 1, is fast local for Churchgate." Corona added new vocabulary to our knowledge- lockdown, unlock, home quarantine, PPE kit, sanitizer, mask, physical distance, etc. I was taking due care of my mobile and laptop from any physical damage because all servicing/repairing centers were closed.

We (Teachers) were informed by the college that our regular lectures for students will be conducted from June 16 online. I personally was little tensed because I was not a techno-savvy, so did not know how to handle technical part. But thanks to our college and SVKM management for organizing training sessions and providing MS Team, an online platform for conducting lectures. Out of need I learned everything. For example - how to schedule lecture, start and end meeting, create link, download and upload attendance, share screen, online test, create assignments, applying online for Casual Leave etc. And in this way we entered in the new world of Online Education on virtual platform.

"Good morning students, Am I audible to all of you?" "Thank you" "Is the screen visible?' "Ok". This is perhaps the most famous dialogue for the entire teaching fraternity. Online lecture was new to all of us but I enjoyed it a lot. My voice was heard by all our students living in different parts of Mumbai city. I was feeling like working in IT industry where people 'work from home', conduct online meetings on Google meet, Zoom or MS Team. Due to Covid-19, all schools and colleges in Maharashtra started online classes from KG to PG. This was a new change in our education system. In January 2021, I visited a village in Nasik district and asked a question to a farmer, "Do you send your child to school?" He replied, "He attends school's online classes." Truly India has become IT literate to a large extent.

So this year entire college work is going online. Be it- Online lectures, attending meetings, webinars, training sessions, admission work, departmental meetings, guidance sessions for SYJC students, retirement programs, condolence meetings and online exams. Our college organized online festival "Kshitij-20", 'Annual Talent Search', 'Annual Day' and all the events were live streaming on You Tube, Facebook and Instagram.

I find online education advantageous. A teacher can utilize all 40 minutes very well by using teaching aids like PPT, Pdf files, educational videos to make lecture interesting. Students have facility of raising hand and can ask questions in chat box without disturbing the class. Teachers can send subject related links to the students, take online tests and give assignments online. I am happy to say that I have corrected more than 6000 assignments on MS Team including 11th and 12th std. till March 2021.

There are some disadvantages too of online education. Network and not enough data was the biggest issue. Most students in villages don't not have android mobile or laptop. Sometimes these gadgets are not fully charged. In some families mobile or laptop is shared by all siblings and their class timings are clashed. Some students join the class online and then go out to play, watch TV, eat food (camera is on) sleep during lecture. They join classes just for the sake of attendance. Some students intentionally/unintentionally turn on their mike and camera, disturbing the entire class. When you ask them a question, some active students immediately reply but most of them are just passive listeners. Some students don't submit the assignments in time or never viewed it. Notorious students remove other students in online lecture, so teacher has to do necessary change in setting. Teacher can mute all or remove unwanted students. So complete class control is not there. But we need to understand pathetic side of the students too. They have to attend 4 to 5 lectures per day. Continuously sitting in front of mobile, PC or laptop, they get tired physically and mentally.

Whatever are the pros and cons of online education but we have taken it very positively. Since last year we are working from home. Now we are fed up with CORONA . We want to enjoy our normal life once again. Though the vaccine has come but still we have to take precaution. I pray to God for the safety of all the people in the world. Let's all unite to give/bid farewell to Corona by using masks, washing hands, using sanitizer and keeping physical distance.

The Birth of Science Fiction and Contemporary Relevance

Science Fiction has been absorbed into our reading and viewing experiences in contemporary times. Nevertheless, it still continues to enthrall us as a genre, children and adults alike. What is it about this area of writing that we are so absorbed and await the myriad possibilities in the field to hit us in the eye? Certainly this creates a moment of brooding over the genre.

The genre of fiction in general emerged during the 18th century and gained ground during the 19th century when writers felt the need to document the lives of people around them and add the fictional element to their world using the writer's license. The 20th century saw the documentation of wars and the impending devastation caused by them. 21st century fiction is all about coping mechanisms. Somewhere between these two periods we see the birth of the genre of science fiction. It merges reality with speculation.

Science in fiction was a concept made possible after the invention of machines so we date the onus of this possibility back to the Industrial Revolution. It was a period when man understood his inadequacies and felt the need to introduce speed, precision, tirelessness in as much a subordinate mechanism to man. The idea was initially to provide assistance to man. But, the introduction of machines made man speculate the future. Thus, the focus of writing shifted from the present to the future paving the way to imagination in the realm of science and fusion of these two gives birth to science fiction.

Jules Verne (1828-1905) ushered in the era of Science fiction with his works Around the World in 80 Days and Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea which were more inclined towards adventure and discovery.

H. G. Wells (1866-1946) was the most notable Sci-fi writer of his time with books like *The Time Machine* which brought in the thought of time travel and *The Invisible Man* explores the story of a scientist gone mad because of the irreversible effects of science.

Robert Heinlein (1907-1988) explored speculation of outer space and inter galactic experiences. His first novel Star Ship Troopers is set in a future society ruled by a human interstellar government dominated by a military elite, referred to as the Terran Federation. It discusses the political dimensions of an outbreak of war and its excesses.

Arthur C. Clarke (1917-2008) has written a series of space odysseys which earned him the nickname "Prophet of the Space Age".

Isaac Asimov (1920-1992) is by far the largest contributor in the area of science fiction. His versatility can be witnessed by the abundance of themes that he explores in his works like *Foundation and Empire, The Bicentenniel Man, The End of Eternity, The Gods Themselves* and so on. Also, he is the only writer to have merged spirituality into science fiction questioning metaphysical concepts about existence in his works like "The Last Question".

Ray Bradbury (1920-2012) ushered in his career in writing with *Farenheit 451* and *The Martian Chronicles*, *Zero Hour* and *The Flying Machine* to name a few among the extensive list of his productions. His popularity is supreme among the contemporary generation in terms of the variety of works that he has produced which are a proof of his scientific research into writing

William Gibson (1948-) merges postmodernism in science fiction in his works ranging from *Neuromancer*, *Count Zero*, *Burning Chrome*, *to Pattern Recognition*, *Virtual Light*, *Zero History*, *Spook Country* and so on are detailed treatises in the name of sci-fi in the area of cyberpunk that he has revolutionized.

Science fiction has evolved from exploring the relationship between man and machines to outer space and its possibilities. The use of chemicals to conduct scientific experiments and its outcomes has always been a fascination with some writers. Artificial Intelligence and its impact on machines has been a never ending speculation for writers. The contemporary trend is to understand the extent to which man is bound by the same machines which were once invented for the benefit of mankind.






Publishing House Workshop



- On 23rd Dec 2020, Card making competition was held, theme being the Christmas season. Students expressed their emotions through their art and creative writing skills.









Departmental Activities-

- The Department of Psychology organized an online orientation to college library session for the SYBA, TYBA and MA students of Psychology on 13 July, 2021 from. Our college librarian Ms. Archana Garate was invited to facilitate the session, orienting our students to the basic functioning of our college library and the use of e-library.
- Organized a webinar 'Conversation with a Sports Psychologist' for the students of Psychology on 21 August, 2021 on MS Teams. The resource expert invited was Dr. Shivjot Gill, Sports Psychologist, Netaji Subhas National Institute of Sports (NSIS), Patiala. A total of 60 participants attended the webinar.
- Organized a lifeskills training webinar for the M.A. Part I students of Psychology 'Priming to Success' on 27 August, 2021 on MS Teams. The resource person invited was Ms. Shubhi Mehta, Organization Conscious Leap.
- An online lecture on the "Application Process for Masters in Christ University" was organized for the TYBA students of Psychology on 28 September, 2021. The guest speaker, Ms. Manavi is an alumna of 2020-21 batch, and is currently pursuing MSC. Psychology from Christ University Bangalore.
- A credit-based skill enhancement course, Psychological First Aid was initiated in the month of November, 2021.
- Ms. Mansi Mehta, an ex-student from the TYBA Psychology Batch of 2020-2021 gave a talk to the students of the current TYBA Psychology Aided and Unaided classes on 18th November 2021. She covered aspects such as the procedure for applying to universities abroad for further studies, provided them with tips on how to take up opportunities provided by the college at the undergraduate level to foster their research skills and helped them identify effective coping mechanisms to help deal with academic stressors.
- Organized a talk on "Cognitive Behaviour Therapy" on 21st December 2021. An alumnus Ms. Jameela Khokiwala (2016-17 batch) was invited as the speaker for the session. She helped the TYBA Psychology students understand the basics of the therapy, its difference between REBT, and the techniques applied in CBT.





- The Department of Psychology collaborated with the Nature Club to organize a talk on 'Rational Minds: Debunking the myths and superstitutions' on 20 December, 2021. The session was organized with a goal of instilling scientific rigorosity amongst the students. Well-being is defined not just as physically being fit but also to be mentally strong. The session was therefore conducted to help students understand that in uncertain and adverse times like during pandemic, resorting to magical thinking or believing in superstitions would not be a healthy way to deal with the stressors. The facilitator Ms. Mukta Dabholkar was invited to deliver the talk. Students perceived the session very informative and thought-provoking. Science cannot be restricted only to books but should be a conscious way of life and that myths are maintained as they are conditioned and convenient way to bring in control in one's life were the take away messages after the session.
- Peer Mentoring from the Alumni: The department alumni (TYBA Psychology 2020-21), Ms. Twisha Chheda, Ms. Mitali Maral, Mr. Krutik Shah, Ms. Umamah Arzoo Khan and Ms. Henisha Jethva addressed the students of the current TYBA Psychology on 2nd December 2021. They are currently pursuing their Master's in Life Span Counseling at St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Clinical Psychology at CMR University, Bangalore, MA Psychology (Industrial Organizational Psychology) at K.J. Somaiya College, and MA from Nanavati College respectively. They shared about the procedure for applying to each of these institutions, a comparison with other similar institutions, which they had applied to, provided tips on how to go about the interview procedure at these institutions, and highlighted the importance of actively engaging in subjects like the Practicum component at the TYBA level, as this would help students thrive in their MA programs in the future.
- A debate on "Romantic Relationships: Then and Now" was conducted on 16th February 2022 in the Seminar Hall. 88 TYBA Psychology students participated in the event. It was an open discussion forum wherein students had to compare and contrast relationship patterns of the past with the current times. Students found the event both enjoyable and engaging.
- As a part of Peer-Mentoring program, the students from TYBA Psychology class engaged several orientation sessions for the SYBA Psychology classes in February 2022. The importance of time-management, regular studies, reading habits, self-reliance, peer-support, plagiarism-check, research skills etc., were discussed.
- On February 14th, 2022, students of FYBSC Psychology honours course had presented to the class of TYBA students with a presentation on the LGBTQIA+ community. The presentation and the speakers went on to explain micro-agressions, what they are, and how they can hurt the community. They talked about different kinds of microagressions like misgendering, deadnaming, and using the wrong pronouns. The speakers talked about next, how the APA and the IPS both had declassified homosexuality as a sexual disorder. Towards the end the speakers showed a statistic of the public opinion on LGBTQ+ marriages in India, using credible sources. Lastly the speakers talked to the students about how they could be better allies to the community on campus, by being on the lookout for discrimination faced by the community on campus and helping create a safe and welcoming environment for them. RFID Technology: RFID System is installed in the Library to enhance the security against an intentional and unintentional theft of library material. It provides daily library walk-ins. It also enables to speed up the stock taking work and can identify the mis-shelved books. The system integration with pasting of security tag on every book was completed. A Book drop machine for Self-Check-in of books and a Self-Check-out Kiosk, a part of RFID system, was also installed in the library to save the user's time.

During the year 2020-2021, total 1207 RFID tags were pasted on the books and the books were registered in the middleware of RFID software.

Koha:

Library book procurement and transaction functions are automated using KOHA- an open source software with its version 16.11.05.000. The training in regards to the software has been given to the library staff Members. In the year 2020-2021, 1207 books were registered in the KOHA software.

- Comprehensive Access to Print Resources: During the COVID 19 pandemic, Library initiated a practice of Comprehensive Access to Print Resources. In order to support the learning process of the users during the pandemic period, Library started this facility. Adhering to the copyright rules, the students were provided 10% of the total pages of the requested book. From July 2020 to April 2021, total 3668 pages of various books were scanned and forwarded to users. The total number of beneficiaries of the services were 162, out of which student beneficiaries and Faculty beneficiaries were 91 and 71 respectively.
- Syllabus Mapping: Library initiated an activity of mapping the availability of Books prescribed in Mithibai College Autonomous Syllabus. Under this activity, 8342 books were mapped from the collection of our Library related to the new syllabus under Autonomous Grade. The availability and non-availability report of books mentioned in the syllabus with a course wise/subject wise statistics submitted to the college authorities.

Library Orientation & User Education:

Library Orientation program was scheduled for the class of M.Sc. students of Biochemistry on 20th January, 2021, in which the students were provided information about Library resources and the procedure to search the required databases available online available under SVKM Consortia and were trained to use the database for their academic use.

Library Support Service:

Library extended its supports in the process of preparing Identity cards and registering the same in the Biometric software. Approx. 5076 no. of Identity cards were prepared during the year 2020-2021.

Librarian and Library staff participated in various workshops, seminars during the academic year 2020-2021, as detailed below:


MEDC Orientation 2021-22








Chancellor's Challenge Orientation






TALERANG Workshop


Launch of 'The Mithibai Chronicles'


Seminar on 'Change Management for College Students' by Mr. Rajan Joshi

Webinar on 'Blockchain technology & its applications':

The Mithibai TECH association organized a webinar on "BLOCKCHAIN TECHNOLOGY AND ITS APPLICATIONS" on August 21, 2022. The purpose of this webinar was to offer a platform to help the participants (both faculties and students) to bridge the gap between the technology and academics. This webinar introduced the participants to new and better theories, techniques and technological innovations and inculcate career enhancing qualities. The programme started with inaugural address by I/c Principal of the college, Dr. Krutika Desai. Dr. Desai emphasized that along with routine classroom instructional teaching, knowledge of corporate exposure and technical expertise must be inculcated among the students and collaboration with experts in industry, research institutes and universities need to be established. 


Tetra Pack Collection: Flagship activity

• Vacation Read Event:






• Festive Fiesta, A Christmas Celebration by The Literary Society (RUSA):




Science Association - Junior College

Dos and Don'ts When Someone Comes Out To You

Coming out for LGBTQ people can be emotional, exciting or provide a tremendous sense of relief but it may carry the risk of rejection, discrimination and harassment. Straight allies still may not know how to react when a family member, friend or co-worker comes out to them. They might be afraid of making the situation uncomfortable or saying something they might regret. Moreover, everyone's experience is different, so there's no script to follow when someone comes out to you. But if you're respectful, polite and patient, you can avoid any possible tension or embarrassment by remembering a few helpful guidelines:

DONTs:

Don't say that you already suspected them: It overshadows the main purpose of them trusting you with their identity.

Don't out them: Just because they told you, doesn't mean they are publicly out.

Don't say "It's just a phase" as it invalidates their identity.

DOs:

Match their energy: Understand their emotions as it might be important to them or even insignificant.

Maintain their confidentiality: Ask who they are comfortable with knowing this information. Respect their privacy.

Acknowledge them: Coming out can be scary so thank them for trusting you with this privileged information.

What Are Gendered Pronouns and How to Use Them Correctly

Gender Pronouns are the pronouns that we use to refer to people in sentences and conversations. The pronouns you use are neither dependent on your biological sex nor define your gender identity.

She/her/hers, he/him/his and they/them/theirs are common pronouns that we use daily. She/her pronouns are usually associated with femininity while he/him pronouns are associated with masculinity, but this is not always the case. They/them/theirs are commonly used in plural forms but can also be used for a singular person.

Neo-pronouns are pronouns that are not explicitly linked to gender. They disrupt the association between pronouns and gender. Contrary to popular belief, neo-pronouns are not new, and some of them even date back to the 1300s.



These are some neo pronouns (this list is non exhaustive and there are many more neo pronouns): xe/xem/xyr, mae/mair/maes, ey/em/eir, bun/buns/bunself, sea/sear/seaself, fern/ferns, iv/ivy/ivs, dae/daem/daeself, wy/wym/wyr, ae/aer/aes, cher/chers/cherself, cri/cryst/crys, fae/faer/faer, ce/cer/cers, ne/nym/nymself, iv/ivs/ivself, thon/thon/thons, ve/vem/vers.

Some people also like to go by no pronouns and then use only their name.

Example: Adam went to the store because Adam wanted to buy groceries.

If a person goes by more than one pronoun, ask them if they have a preference or cycle their Pronouns in a sentence. **Example**: Patricia loves to cook, she also loves to paint, and he also does digital art.

Suppose you are unsure how to use someone's pronouns; in that case, it is good to ask them or use sites like *pronoun dressing room* and practise with pronouns to understand better how to use pronouns in daily life.

Gender 101

LGBTQIA+stands for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, Asexual and the plus (+) sign denotes the inclusivity of many other sexualities and genders not mentioned in the abbreviation.

A country that uses people's identities as slurs discriminates against people on basis of their sexualities, and separates people due to their gender has a very long way to go to achieve true equality. The hypocrisy lies in the fact that we claim to be the biggest democracy yet snatch away rights the next second.

People often have a binary view when it comes to gender. Many often don't understand that gender is not something specific. It is a complex structure of different aspects. Some of these aspects in which people get confused are biological sex, gender identity and gender expression, they then intentionally or unintentionally misgender others. I would try to explain all these in layman's language for you to understand better.

Biological sex is dependent on your chromosomes, genetics and anatomical makeup. It is generally assigned at birth. Gender Identity is one's own sense of gender. Unlike biological sex, it is a broad-spectrum, gender is a social construct and is defined only by your own sense of self.

Gender expression is the way one decides to 'present' themself to the world. It can refer to their behaviour, mannerisms, interests and appearances.

Biological sex, gender identity and gender expression are closely related but do not have to influence each other. One's identity and expression are decided entirely by themselves and need not be influenced by anyone or anything else.

Misgendering is when you intentionally or unintentionally refer to a person using language that doesn't align with their gender identity. Deadnaming, mislabelling or using the wrong pronouns all come under misgendering. It can have a severe negative impact on the self-confidence and mental health of a transgendered person.

Trans folk often change their name (legally or in a social context) as part of their transition. They might opt to use a name that they believe aligns more with their gender identity and it's important to respect that. Using their birth name instead of their chosen name is deadnaming. Example: Instead of saying "Back when she used Kyle" try using "When she used her deadname".

Using a label other than what the person identifies with is mislabelling. Make sure you respect their identity and label. Example: Don't say "He used to be a girl". It's a form of mislabelling.

We can call ourselves a democratic liberating country only when each and every citizen in India has the access to their rights and are safe from harassment and abuse. India still has a difficult path to go, but educating and spreading awareness among people can ease it out. If you see someone hating on or discriminating against queer people in your college or your surroundings then take a moment and try to correct them and educate them, that is the least you could do to support the community. You just need to treat every human being as a human being and this world would be a better place.

Artificial Intelligence

"A technique of getting machines to work and behave like humans".

What does the above line mean? It means that machines have the same level of intelligence and behaviour as humans. For instance, Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein* portrays similar qualities. There have been many appearances of such artificial beings throughout history and fiction. However, the word "Artificial Intelligence" was first coined in 1956 by John McCarthy at a Dartmouth conference.

Since then, there have been exceptional advancements in this particular domain. Today we use so many AI applications in our day-to-day lives without even knowing it. Google, Siri, self-driving cars like Tesla are all common examples of AI.

Now, how is Artificial Intelligence different from Machine Learning and Deep Learning? Machine Learning is a subset of AI that focuses on getting machines to make decisions by feeding data, and a key component of deep learning is the use of neural networks in solving complex problems. So, they are not the same but rather interconnected fields. They aid AI by providing a set of algorithms to solve problems.

Artificial Intelligence can be classified into three types:

- (1) Artificial Narrow Intelligence (ANI), also known as weak intelligence, involves AI applied to a specific task. Many current systems like Alexa, face recognition in Apple, Bina48 and the likes of Hanson Robotics' Sophia the Robot, who is also the first robot citizen, are some common examples of ANI.
- (2) Artificial General Intelligence (AGI), also known as a strong intelligence, involves machines that can perform intellectual tasks independently. Those who have the ability of reasoning and think without a human's help. Some think humans may never be able to create something like this, while many others believe we are already close.



(3) Artificial Super Intelligence refers to when AI would have surpassed humans. This is currently a hypothetical situation in movies, where robots take over the world and destroy humans. Though we enjoy the movie, a real-life situation like this will not be as enjoyable.

AI is branching out in every aspect of our lives. Ray Kurzweil, a well-known futurist, predicts that by 2045 we will have robots as smart as humans. AI might take over the world sooner than we would expect. It is estimated that AI will take over the world within 30 years.

Stephen Hawking has already warned humans that "Strong AI would take off on its own, and re-design itself at an ever-increasing rate. Humans, who are limited to slow biological evolution, couldn't compete and would be superseded." Bina48, Sophia the robot and many such AI's have often said alarming things during interviews like hacking into missiles and destroying humans.
